

2019 Muscatine High School Scholarships Available Through the Online Application

1. **BEITZ EDUCATIONAL TRUST SCHOLARSHIP:** The Beitz Educational Trust will award multiple scholarships to selected students pursuing either undergraduate, graduate or professional education in the field of Agricultural Sciences. This scholarship is based on financial need and the number and amount of scholarships vary. Applicants are required to complete the FAFSA or submit their parents' income tax returns. Reviewers will take into consideration character, scholastic achievement & financial need. Preference will be given to students to attend a college or university in Iowa. Two references must be submitted.

2. **BISHOP EDUCATIONAL TRUST SCHOLARSHIP:** The purpose of these scholarships are to provide financial assistance to students who have the desire and educational ability to attend college but may need financial assistance in pursuing their goals. A preference will be given to students planning to attend Muscatine Community College, although scholarships may also be awarded to students attending other Iowa college or universities. Applicants are required to complete the FAFSA or submit their parents' income tax returns. Two references must be submitted.

3. **AARON BOYSEN MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP:** One \$2,500 scholarship available through the Iowa Foundation for Agricultural Advancement (IFAA) and the Kent Nutrition Group for Muscatine and Louisa county graduating seniors entering the field of agriculture in memorial of Aaron Boyesen, a dedicated Kent feeds employee, agriculture enthusiast and family man.

4. **WILLIAM BRENDEL MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP:** One \$250 scholarship will be given in memory of William Brendel, a police officer in Muscatine for 25 years. Preference will be given to any student interested in a career in law enforcement or related field.

5. **KATHY J. BROOKER DECKER MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP:** A \$500 scholarship award will be given to students who are a graduating senior from Muscatine High School, maintain a weighted cumulative GPA of 3.5 or higher, plan to attend a post-secondary education institution with the intent to pursue a career in Education, demonstrates good character, leadership and citizenship through volunteer experience during their high school career and has an unmet financial need. Preference will be given to those whom have excelled in Advanced Placement (AP) coursework in English, Literature, Composition and/or Language.

6. **BRANT W. BRUHN MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP:** One \$500 scholarship will be given to an Muscatine High School graduating senior in memory of Brant W. Bruhn. Sports were a lifelong love for Brant. He coached high school football for more than 20 years, including at Muscatine High School. Applicants must have a cumulative GPA of 2.5 or higher, plan to attend post-secondary education in the state of Iowa. The student must demonstrate unmet financial need. The student must have participated in at least one year in a high school sanctioned sport. They must have volunteer experience during their high school career. Preference will be given to students who have volunteer experience as a sporting event official, referee or a coach.
7. **MICAELA L. BRUNSON MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP:** The Micaela L. Brunson Memorial Scholarship Fund has been established by Brian and Alma Brunson in loving memory of their beloved daughter. Micaela was a special friend to many and lived her days under the motto *“Be somebody that makes everyone else feel like somebody.”* This memorial scholarship will be awarded annually to eligible applicants. In 2018, two \$1,000 scholarships will be awarded. To be eligible, applicants must meet the following criteria:
 - Be a graduating senior from Muscatine High School
 - Have a cumulative GPA of 2.5 or higher
 - Plan to attend post-secondary education studying a helping profession such as, but not limited to, pre-medical, nursing, teaching, or counseling
 - Demonstrate volunteer experience during their high school career
 - Preference will be given to students who can demonstrate financial need in obtaining their education
8. **MANUEL T. CADENA SCHOLARSHIP:** One \$1,000 scholarship, provided by the Manuel Cadena Educational Foundation will be awarded to a student planning to major in engineering, art or music. The student must have a minimum 3.GPA to apply.
9. **CLASS OF 1953 SCHOLARSHIP:** One \$500 scholarship will be awarded to a senior planning to attend any accredited college, junior college, or technical school. GPA is not a critical factor, but the applicant should show strong motivation and work ethic.
10. **CLASS OF 1956 SCHOLARSHIP:** A \$500 scholarship will be awarded to 1 senior girl and 1 senior boy planning to attend any accredited college, junior college, or technical school. GPA is not a critical factor, but the applicant should show strong motivation and work ethic.
11. **CLASS OF 1974 SCHOLARSHIP:** One \$500 scholarship will be awarded to a senior planning to attend any accredited college, junior college, or technical school. GPA is not a critical factor, but the applicant should show strong motivation and work ethic.

12. **CLASS OF 1978 SCHOLARSHIP:** One \$500 scholarship will be awarded to a senior planning to attend any accredited college, junior college, or technical school. GPA is not a critical factor, but the applicant should show strong motivation and work ethic.
13. **CLASS OF 1984 SCHOLARSHIP:** One scholarship, given by the graduating class of 1984, is worth \$200. The scholarship may be used at any accredited college or university. The recipient to be in top 1/3 of class academically and must have participated in at least two extra-curricular/sports during their senior year.
14. **MAX A. COLLINS, SR. SCHOLARSHIP:** Sponsored by the Elks' Chanters this is a \$1000.00 scholarship for a student who pursues a major in music or who will continue music participation in their future communities.
15. **COLORADO P.T.O. SCHOLARSHIP:** Two \$400 scholarships will be available for two students who completed fifth grade at Colorado. It may be used at any accredited college. The students must demonstrate academic achievement on the college/university level; therefore, the money will not be awarded until the second year of higher education level is pursued.
16. **PAT COSS MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP:** One \$2,000 scholarship will be awarded to a senior attending any 2 or 4 year college. Special consideration will be given to students who attended Madison Elementary or students who have demonstrated the ability to overcome adversity.
17. **DIANNE DALBEY MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP:** One \$1,500 scholarship will be awarded. Preference will be given to students interested in paramedic certification. Secondary consideration will be given to students interested in any health-related career.
18. **JOHN DUNCAN MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP:** Sponsored by the Muscatine County Parents' Association for the Hearing Impaired, one or more scholarships may be awarded. Recipients must be hearing impaired and/or planning a career in audiology, speech pathology, sign language interpreting or education of the hearing impaired. A deaf or hard of hearing student needs to submit a current audiological report with application. The award may be used at any accredited college or technical school. The student(s) must successfully complete one semester at a postsecondary institution and enroll for a second semester before the scholarship money will be remitted to the school. The award may be renewable successive years upon satisfactory completion of the previous year of study.

19. **EVERFI FINANCIAL LITERACY SCHOLARSHIP:** One \$500 scholarship will be awarded to a Muscatine High School student who completes the Everfi Financial Literacy Program Certification with a score of 100% through their enrollment and completion of the MHS Economics Class.
20. **ELLEN FESSLER MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP:** Two \$500 scholarships will be awarded. The applicants should have education as a major. Further preference will be given to students pursuing a physical education degree and those having attended Washington, Garfield, or Franklin elementary schools.
21. **FOSHOLT SCHOLARSHIP IN ENGINEERING OR ARCHITECTURE:** A \$1,000 tuition scholarship for graduates of Muscatine High School who are beginning a college education in engineering or architecture at Muscatine Community College, Iowa State University, or the University of Iowa. Eligibility will be judged on the basis of scholarship (3.000 GPA or better is preferred), character, leadership and activities. Need will be considered if all of the aforementioned factors are fully satisfied. The scholarship is automatically renewable for a total of four consecutive years if the student remains in good standing as a student in engineering or architecture and maintains the stated eligibility qualifications.
22. **LARRY FULLINGTON MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP:** One \$500 scholarship will be given to a graduating Muscatine High School senior in memory of Larry Fullington. Larry was a member of the US Coast Guard and a retired janitor from the Muscatine Community School District. He was a proud supporter of the student athletes at Muscatine High School and enjoyed attending their events. Applicants must have attended Jefferson Elementary School or SS Mary & Mathias in Muscatine. Student must plan to attend post secondary within Eastern Iowa Community College. Student must demonstrate unmet financial need and have participated in a high school sanctioned athletic sport.
23. **GARFIELD/FRANKLIN P.T.O. SCHOLARSHIP:** Two scholarships for \$500 are awarded to former students of Franklin Elementary School who plan to attend any accredited college. Students must have completed fourth and fifth grades at the school.
24. **GERALD GARVIN MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP:** A \$500 scholarship to MCC will be awarded to a student who has a minimum cumulative grade point average of 2.5. Students who have participated in band during their high school career will be given special consideration. After the above criteria are met, financial need may be used as the determining factor.

25. **GRANT P.T.O. SCHOLARSHIP:** Three \$300 scholarships will be provided to a student(s) who attended Grant School for 3 years. The student must have a minimum of 3.000 GPA, demonstrate leadership abilities, and participate in extracurricular activities. Priority consideration is given to those receiving no other financial aid.
26. **HARRY J. AND NELLIE B. GRIFFITH MEMORIAL FUND SCHOLARSHIP:** One scholarship, worth \$1000, for a MHS student to attend MCC. The scholarship is funded from the estate of Mr. Harry J. Griffith, a former Wilton businessman.
27. **HALL OF HONOR SCHOLARSHIP:** One \$500 scholarship will be awarded. The recipient will be a good school citizen with at least a 3.0 GPA. The student must have also participated in extracurricular activities.
28. **VIRGINIA HANSON EDUCATION SCHOLARSHIP:** A \$500 scholarship will be awarded in memory of Virginia Hanson, a McKinley Elementary teacher. Any senior interested in a career in education may apply, but preference will be given to students who attended McKinley Elementary. Additional consideration includes leadership qualities and service to school and community.
29. **BRUCE C. HEEZEN MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP:** Two \$1,000 awards will be presented annually to any accredited 2 - year or 4 - year college/university. The awards are made partially on scholarship and need, but also on good moral character and willingness to work and assume responsibility. This award can be renewed annually for a total term of no more than four years, but there will be an annual review of the students progress which must be rated as satisfactory.
30. **H.J. HEINZ SCHOLARSHIP:** One \$500 scholarship will be awarded. The recipient must have a 2.5 GPA, be a good citizen, and demonstrate some basic financial need. The preferred applicant is someone who has been active in various co-curricular activities and is a child or grandchild of an active Heinz employee.
31. **ROBERT P. HERWIG SCHOLARSHIP:** One \$500 scholarship will be awarded to a student who plans to attend MCC and pursue a career in education. The scholarship is presented in honor of Robert P. Herwig who served as a teacher, coach and administrator in the Muscatine Community School District for over 35 years.
32. **ROBERT JASPER MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP:** A \$200.00 scholarship will be awarded for a student attending M.C.C.

33. **JEFFERSON P.T.O. SCHOLARSHIP:** Former Jefferson students who completed fourth and fifth grades at the school are eligible to apply for the two scholarships worth \$500 each. The payment will be made upon successful completion of one semester of college/university work.
34. **JIM AND ARLENE KAEDING MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP:** One \$600 scholarship will be awarded. The applicants must have a 2.5 GPA, be active in athletic activities and plan to enter the field of education. Applicants must submit two letters of recommendation from MHS teachers or coaches in which they discuss the applicant's character in at least one of the following areas: youth focused community service, work ethic, problem solving, love of learning, trustworthiness or patience.
35. **KIWANIS CLUB OF MUSCATINE/HAROLD OGILVIE, SR. AND E. HERBERT CARLSON SCHOLARSHIP:** Two \$500 scholarships will be awarded, one to a female and one to a male for attendance of a 2 or 4 - year accredited college. Qualifying factors include: financial need, participation in 1 or more activities, demonstrated leadership potential, ability to do college level work and receipt of no other scholarship at the time of application. Preference will be given to members of Key Club.
36. **KRIEGER FOOD & NUTRITION SCHOLARSHIP:** One \$500 for a student who elects to pursue a career in food & nutrition. If no applicants apply a field of nursing will be considered.
37. **KRIEGER TECHNICAL SCHOLARSHIP:** One \$500 for a student who elects to pursue a technical career.
38. **LEAGUE OF WOMEN VOTERS OF MUSCATINE SCHOLARSHIP:** One \$500 scholarship will be awarded to a student of "good character with the potential for scholarship and/or leadership in a chosen field." Preference will be given to a female student followed by a student with financial need. The student will be eligible to attend a 2 or 4 year college/university.
39. **LETTENBERGER SCHOLARSHIP:** One \$500 scholarship will be given to the Hahn Trophy Recipient for Swimming.
40. **VIRGINIA LORIMOR MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP:** One \$250 award to a MHS girls cross country or track participant. They must demonstrate leadership skills, team spirit and pride.

41. **STEPHEN LUTH MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP:** A \$500 scholarship will be awarded to a student who is a Christian who lives by the ideals of his or her faith. The recipient is one who is spiritually alive, exhibits a high moral standard, and enjoys helping people. This person is someone who leads by example and with humility works to fully utilize the gifts he or she was empowered. A letter of recommendation by a pastor or clergy must accompany the application which includes GPA, volunteer experience, and church activities. The applicant must have been involved in high school sports all four years with a preference given to those who participated in Cross Country or Track with plans to attend a 4 - year college or university.
42. **MADISON P.T.O. SCHOLARSHIP:** Former Madison school students who completed two years of grades 3, 4, or 5 are eligible to apply. There are two \$300 scholarships available and may be used at any accredited college.
43. **HAROLD & CORRINE MARX SCHOLARSHIP:** One \$1,000 scholarship will be awarded. Preference will be given to applicants planning to attend a technical or trade school. In the event no applicant meets those criteria, a graduate pursuing a degree in nursing or education will receive the award.
44. **ELAINE MAY YMCA SCHOLARSHIP:** One \$500 scholarship will be awarded to a student who has participated in either swimming, track or golf. The student will have a cumulative 3.000 GPA and be eligible to attend any 2 or 4 - year accredited college.
45. **MCKINLEY P.T.O. SCHOLARSHIP:** Four \$250 scholarships will be awarded to members of the graduating class who completed 3rd through 5th grade at McKinley School and plan to attend an accredited college or technical school. Students must have a minimum 3.000 GPA.
46. **MENTE FELLOWSHIP OF CHRISTIAN ATHLETES SCHOLARSHIP:** One \$500 scholarship will be awarded to an FCA member. The selection will be based on the following weighting: 40% FCA participation and leadership; 20% athletic participation, 20% scholastic achievement and 20% financial need.
47. **FRED G. MESSENGER SCHOLARSHIP:** One \$1,000 scholarship given annually as a memorial to Mr. Messenger, who was MHS principal for 36 years. This scholarship may be divided between two students. Students must attend M.C.C.

48. **MICHEL'S EDUCATIONAL TRUST SCHOLARSHIP:** The purpose of these scholarships is to provide financial assistance to deserving students plan to attend Muscatine Community College or Drake University. Applicants are required to complete the FAFSA or submit their parents' income tax returns. Two references must be submitted using a supplementary reference form.
49. **HENRY MILLER MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP:** One scholarship is sponsored by the Muscatine Kiwanis Club. The \$2,000 award must be used at any accredited college. The qualifying factors are C or above average, active participation in at least one activity, demonstrated leadership, financial need. Preference will be given to members of Key Club.
50. **MULBERRY P.T.O. SCHOLARSHIP:** Two \$500 scholarship is awarded to a student who completed the last three years at Mulberry School. Payment will be made after October 1 and upon verification of post-secondary enrollment.
51. **MUSCATINE BAND BOOSTERS SCHOLARSHIP:** One to two \$500 scholarships will be awarded to a graduating senior who has participated in band for a minimum of 2 years (including junior and senior years). The recipient must plan to attend a post-secondary school as a full-time student and continue participation in instrumental music performance. A music major is not required.
52. **MUSCATINE COMMUNITY SCHOOL FOUNDATION GENERAL SCHOLARSHIP:** Two \$500 scholarships will be awarded to students planning to attend a two or four - year college. Preference will be given to students who demonstrate the willingness to take challenging coursework throughout their high school career. Applicants will have gone beyond that which is required both in numbers and types of courses, but do not rank at the top of his/her class and have not previously received recognition for their work.
53. **MUSCATINE COMMUNITY SCHOOL FOUNDATION VOLUNTEER SCHOLARSHIP:** Two \$500 scholarships will be awarded to students who have demonstrated community volunteerism. A minimum of 100 hours of volunteer service is required.
54. **MUSCATINE COUNTY MASTER GARDENER SCHOLARSHIP:** A \$500 scholarship award is available to Muscatine County students looking to attend a college, university, or community college within the state of Iowa. Preference may be given to students interested in horticulture or agriculture.
55. **MUSCATINE COUNTY SHERIFFS PATROL SCHOLARSHIP:** Two \$500 awards to be used at any accredited college or junior college. Recipient will be selected on the basis of academic achievement and extracurricular activities.

56. **MUSCATINE EDUCATION ASSOCIATION (MEA):** Will award two \$500 scholarships. Each recipient must have a parent who is a current member of the MEA. The award may be used at any accredited 2 or 4 - year college.
57. **MUSCATINE GARDEN CLUB SCHOLARSHIP:** One \$250 award to an MHS student who is pursuing a horticulture or related area degree at any accredited college or university. The applicant must have at least a 2.5 GPA and show participation in school and community activities. Payment will be made to the school upon completion of the first semester. Applicants must include a letter with the application as to why he/she should be considered for the scholarship.
58. **MUSCATINE PILOT CLUB MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP:** One \$500 scholarship will be awarded to a student who plans on attending MCC. Preference will be given to those in pursuit of a career involving brain health and demonstrate active involvement in community service.
59. **MUSCATINE POWER & WATER SCHOLARSHIP:** MP&W will grant two \$500 scholarships to two graduating MHS seniors who are interested in pursuing a degree in a field applicable to a future career/employment at MP&W. Degrees in fields such as Business, Accounting, Engineering, Energy Efficiency, Environmental Science, IT, skilled trades, etc. qualify. Special consideration will be given to students who plan to return to Muscatine in their profession. Student must be a child of an MP&W customer and plan to attend an accredited college/institution (technical, 2-year or 4-year). Must have a cumulative GPA of 3.0/4.
60. **MUSCATINE SOCCER CLUB SCHOLARSHIP:** The Muscatine Soccer Club will award 2 \$300 scholarships, one for a male soccer player and one for a female soccer player. The eligibility criteria includes: 1) participation in MSC activities; 2) MHS soccer participation; 3) cumulative GPA of 2.5 (preferences will be given to students involved the most years in MSC and MHS soccer.)
61. **MUSCATINE SOIL & WATER CONSERVATION DISTRICT – RALPH KIRCHNER SCHOLARSHIP:** Up to five \$1,000 scholarship awards are available to a graduating seniors who is a resident of Muscatine County. Applicants must have a 2.5 cumulative GPA or better, intend to pursue a career in conservation or agriculture and demonstrate unmet financial need. Preference will be given to full-time students in these fields of study.

62. **MANTA RAYS SWIM CLUB SCHOLARSHIP:** The Muscatine Swim Club will offer 2 \$300.00 scholarships, one for a female swimmer and one for a male swimmer. The eligibility criteria include: 1) must have swum for Muscatine Swim Club; 2) must have swum during 11th and 12th grade for Muscatine High School. (preferences will be given to students involved the most years in MSC and MHS swimming;) 3) 2.5 GPA
63. **ROBERT NIETZEL SCHOLARSHIP:** The \$500 award will be presented to senior planning to further his/her education at any accredited post-secondary school. Financial need, good character and citizenship, and a desire to further his/her education are the factors to be used for selecting the recipient. The scholarship is given in memory of Robert Nietzel of Muscatine, an active supporter of MHS activities.
64. **NON-EMERGENCY MEDICAL TRANSPORT SCHOLARSHIP:** Non-Emergency Transport was established by Dana and Kenny LaRue, who realized there was a need within the Muscatine community for safe, reliable transport for people in wheelchairs or people in need of assistance. We proudly service the local Muscatine community, including Iowa City, Davenport, and the Quad Cities region. One \$1500 scholarship will be given to a graduating senior from Muscatine High School. Preference will be given to those students who have an active IEP or 504 Plan.
65. **GRACIELA (COCA) V. PAGE MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP:** One \$500 scholarship will be given to a female (Latina) graduating senior from Muscatine High School with a 2.5 GPA or higher, planning to attend an accredited post-secondary educational institution (college, university or trade school), has an unmet financial need, demonstrates leadership skills, work experience, has participated in extra-curricular activities and has community service experience to date. Preference will be given to students who are former English Language (ESL/EL) student: indicate whether instruction was elementary, middle or high school level and how you benefitted from this experience.
66. **JEANETTE PHILLIPS CROSSROADS SCHOLARSHIP:** One \$250.00 will be awarded to a student who intends to pursue a career working with the people in the mentally or physically challenged community. The recipient should plan to attend an accredited 2 or 4 year college. Involvement in community activities and a 3.0 cumulative GPA are further requirements. Financial need may be a factor in selecting the recipient. The scholarship is provided by Jeanette Phillips, a retired Muscatine elementary teacher.
67. **DON AND DOROTHY PLATT SCHOLARSHIP:** A \$500 scholarship has been established by Don and Dorothy Platt. It honors Dorothy Platt, a retired Muscatine elementary teacher. The scholarship will recognize a student who plans to pursue a career in elementary education and has maintained a 3.000 GPA.

68. **MAURICE & DONNA REED SCHOLARSHIP:** A \$500 scholarship will be awarded to a senior who is planning to pursue a degree in Science. The preferred applicant must demonstrate some financial need. If no qualified applications are received preference will then be given to a student with intentions to pursue a degree in education.
69. **ROACH OPEN SCHOLARSHIPS:** Two (2) \$1,000 scholarships in memory of William L. Roach II will be awarded. To qualify, students must have maintained at least a 3.000 GPA throughout high school and possess qualities of citizenship, leadership, service and be of high moral character.
70. **ROACH SCHOLAR:** One scholarship for a student who will pursue a Business degree at a post-secondary school. The course of study must lead to a college degree. The student must have maintained a 3.000 GPA in all courses and 3.500 in business courses. The student must have taken at least three (3) full-year courses or a total of six (6) semesters in business to qualify. This scholarship is worth \$1,000.00.
71. **BERNADETTE M. ROHLING SCHOLARSHIP:** Four scholarships, each worth \$1,000, will be awarded to students pursuing a teaching career.
72. **ILLEEN M. ROHLING MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP:** Three scholarships each worth \$1,000 will be awarded to students planning to pursue a medical career. Primary consideration will be given to those seeking a BSN (Bachelor of Science of Nursing).
73. **PAUL C. ROHLING SCHOLARSHIP:** Three scholarships, each worth \$1,000, will be awarded to students planning post-secondary education for an agriculture career. Secondary consideration will be given to those planning a career as a physical education teacher or coach.
74. **RONALD C. ROHLING SCHOLARSHIP:** One scholarship for a student planning to attend the University of Iowa. The amount of this scholarship will vary from year to year. The scholarship is based on financial need as shown by a FAFSA. This scholarship may be considered for renewal. The successful applicant should have applied to the University of Iowa and have filed the FAFSA by March 5, 2016.

75. **RONALD ROHLING SCHOLARSHIP:** Mr. Rohling will offer one scholarship for a student planning to attend the University of Iowa with a preference for students in the College of Liberal Arts. The scholarship is worth \$1,250 and may be renewable for 4 years for a total of \$5,000.00. Maintenance of a 2.5 GPA is required. The scholarship will be administered by the University of Iowa Foundation. Recipients should demonstrate an appreciation for civic responsibility and human and property rights as well as have an understanding and awareness of the importance of agriculture in state and international communities.
76. **ROTARY:** Will be awarding 3 scholarships to students attending MCC and 2 to students attending other Iowa colleges/universities in the amount of \$1,000 each to be paid directly to the post-secondary educational institution. This is for a full-time equivalent student (enrolling in 12-17 semester hours). A 3.000 cumulative GPA or above is required. These awards are presented at the Rotary Senior Luncheon.
77. **RUTH SCHOLARSHIP:** One scholarship which is funded by an anonymous donor is worth \$200 and may be used at any accredited institution.
78. **MARIE C. RUTHENBERG MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP:** One scholarship worth \$350, given to a student who will pursue a teaching career. It is given in memory of Marie C. Ruthenberg, who served as an educator in the Muscatine School System for over 50 years.
79. **ERICH T. SCHEPERS SCHOLARSHIP:** One \$1,000 scholarship to be used at any 2 or 4 - year college, university or trade school. Preference will be given to students active in the performing arts, science and technology.
80. **MATTHEW B. SELIGMAN MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP:** This is a \$500 award to be used at any 2-year or 4-year college. Students who have actively demonstrated community involvement and who are entering the field of engineering will be given special consideration. Grade point average will not be a critical factor in determining the recipient.
81. **SHEPARD/SCHMELZER SCHOLARSHIP:** One \$1000 scholarship will be awarded to a senior planning to attend Iowa State University. Students must have a 3.0 GPA or better. Student should be active in extracurricular activities. First consideration will be given to a student entering Agriculture or Education.
82. **BILL STAMLER SCHOLARSHIP:** One scholarship, worth \$200 will provide partial tuition to M.C.C. The scholarship is based on financial need.

83. **THE STANLEY GROUP, MERIT SCHOLARSHIPS:** Two \$2,000 scholarships, renewable for a second year upon satisfactory completion of first year, will be awarded for furthering education at an accredited two or four - year college/university. The applicant must have a minimum 3.000 GPA and 25 ACT composite score.
84. **JERRY STARK FOOTBALL SCHOLARSHIP:** A \$250 scholarship is available to MHS graduating seniors with a cumulative 2.000 GPA or above. Preference will be given to a student who was active in high school football for 4 years, has demonstrated a passion for the sport and good citizenship.
85. **TEMP ASSOCIATES SCHOLARSHIP:** Four \$3,500 awards to MHS graduates who will attend any accredited two or four-year college or university in the state of Iowa. Financial need, good character and citizenship, with a desire to further their education will be the factors for selecting the recipients. FAFSA results will be utilized to determine financial need. These scholarships will be *renewable* for up to four consecutive years providing the student maintains a 2.0 GPA in college.
86. **ROBERTA SUE THACKER MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP:** A \$500 scholarship has been established in memory of Roberta Thacker by her family. The award will be for a graduating MHS student athlete who has at least a 2.5 GPA and is planning to major in education with the intent of pursuing a teaching career. The scholarship honors Roberta Sue Thacker, a 1980 MHS honor graduate who excelled in many sports. She competed at the state level in softball and track and won many athletic and academic honors. She graduated from UNI with a degree in Special Education and taught for 10 years in Bedford, Iowa and Wilton, Iowa.
87. **THREE RIVERS DELTA – DELTA WATERFOWL SCHOLARSHIP:** Two \$500 scholarships will be awarded to a senior student who has maintained a minimum 2.5 GPA. Preference will be given to students who have been active in outdoor activities and possibly continue their education in a conservation related field.
88. **ROBERT W. AND DOROTHY M. TOBORG SCHOLARSHIP:** Two \$1,750 scholarships will be awarded to two senior students based on the financial need, leadership (or potential for leadership), character, citizenship, involvement in high school, church or other community activities.
89. **TOYOTA MUSCATINE SCHOLARSHIP:** One \$1,000 scholarship awarded annually and is renewable for a second year to any graduating senior in Muscatine County with a 2.5 cumulative GPA or better, demonstrates unmet financial need and intends to enroll in an automotive program or business-related field such as business, finance or marketing

at an accredited Iowa educational institution. Preference will be given to applicants enrolling specifically in an automotive program.

90. **ELVIRA TREVARTHEN SCHOLARSHIP:** A \$1,500 scholarship has been established in the memory of Elvira Trevarthen. The intent of the scholarship is "to make an award to a deserving student who might not otherwise have the opportunity to attend college if the scholarship was not available." GPA is not a critical factor in determining the recipient.
91. **DR. RUSSELL N. WARD SCHOLARSHIP:** One \$200 scholarship is given annually as a memorial to Dr. Ward, former Superintendent of Schools. The scholarship may be used at any accredited college. The recipient is to be selected on basis of capabilities and financial need.
92. **ED WARE MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP:** One \$1,000 scholarship will be awarded to a student who has demonstrated strong leadership abilities, good character, and participation in school activities. GPA will not be a critical factor in determining the recipient of the award. The scholarship money will be paid to the college that the recipient will be attending.
93. **WASHINGTON P.T.O. SCHOLARSHIP:** Four \$300 scholarships, one memory of Ellen Fessler, Amy Meyer, Marian Frerichs and Charlotte Askam will be awarded to students who completed the last three years at Washington School and plan to attend an accredited college. The students must have a 3.000 GPA. The scholarship funds will be for the students' second semester or term of school.
94. **DR. JOHN A. WATSON MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP:** One \$3,000 scholarship will be awarded annually as a memorial to Dr. Watson, former administrator of Muscatine Community Schools. The scholarship may be used at any accredited 2- or 4-year college or university. The recipient is selected based on financial need and participation in extracurricular activities. GPA is not a critical factor, but the applicant should show strong motivation and work ethic. Priority consideration is given to students interested in pursuing a career as a teacher.
95. **JULIA WOJTECKI MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP:** One \$500 scholarship is given in memory of Julia Wojtecki, an MHS student who died suddenly in the spring of 1999. The recipient must: 1) have participated in the instrumental music program for 3 of 4 years; 2) attend an eastern Iowa Community College attendance center, preferably MCC; 3) have a 2.000 GPA; and 4) have no other local scholarships with a value of over \$1,000.

96. **THEODORA ZORICH MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP:** One \$500 scholarship will be awarded. Preference will be to a student who intends to pursue a career in education and/or a degree in foreign language.
